## Club Assembly Revisited

Growth, participation, financial stability and fellowship are on track for the rest of the year, according to Fredericksburg Rotary Club President Hugh Fuller in last week's Club Assembly.

Total number of active members has increased to 88, from 84 at the beginning of this Rotary year. Average meeting turnout has risen to 86 percent, with more than half of all members posting individual attendance rates of 100 percent.

Participation in the approximately 35 different Rotary sponsored/sanctioned activities is tracked at 93 percent, with notable involvement by new members. Serve Above Self opportunities include such big-ticket programs as Toys for Tots campaign, Wings Over the Hills nature festival and the twice-a-year Wounded Warriors salute, and smaller, but equally important programs like Books for Babies, InterAct, and, new this year, Rotoract and the well-received Volunteer Fair.

Additional thanks were offered to those who set up for and tidy after each week's meeting.

Fiscal reporting included a projected bottom-line for this year, ending June 30, of more than \$1,300. Presently, "fishbowl" contributions total slightly less than \$1K, the Birthday Check scholarship account boasts \$7,288 and Toys for Tots has a balance of \$5,286. Wings, which donated \$6,500 to the club in its first year, retained enough "seed" money to launch this year's festival.

Polio Plus contributions have already exceeded the annual suggested donation, and to-date 37 Rotarians have fulfilled their EREY (Every Rotarian Every Year) \$100 donation to the RI Foundation for this year.

As for camaraderie, plenty of social events are on-tap to help fulfill our unofficial fifth-test: Is it Fun? In the next few weeks, plan to enjoy our Valentine's Sweetheart Luncheon set for next Monday, Feb. 13, and the Mardi Gras Party planned the evening of Feb. 20. District Governor Sherri Muniz will be visiting us at our March 5 meeting. Watch the calendar section of Das Rad for further upcoming events.
